





for some laughs? Lyric fan favorite, **Sarge** (Friday, March 14th at 7pm), tickles the ivories...and your funny bone! Sarge, a one-of-a-kind comedian and musical savant, delivers one of the most entertaining and hilarious performances ever to hit the stage. His rapid-fire, off-the-cuff style of

observational comedy takes aim on anyone and everyone, including the audience - so be forewarned! In addition to his traditional comedy act, Sarge does spot-on singing impressions of such well-known performers as Stevie Wonder, Lionel Richie and Harry Connick, Jr. His talents at the piano are equally prodigious: He often creates an elaborate, lengthy medley on the spot from songs suggested by audience members. Needless to say, no two shows are ever alike.

Born in Florida during the tumultuous 1960s, Sarge was the son of a Jewish mother and black father. Shortly after birth, Sarge was put up for adoption and was taken in and raised by a couple living in Long Island, New York. An initial childhood interest in music blossomed into a fruitful relationship with the piano. However, growing up, the entertainer struggled with

drug abuse and homelessness, eventually finding peace in 1990 and quitting his addiction cold turkey. From then on, Sarge decided to devote his life to helping others who are going through the same struggle. This personality-shaping experience was a crucial element of Sarge's eventual decision to become a comedian, learning to therapeutically deal with trying situations through the outlet of comedy.

Sarge has been featured on HBO and Comedy Central, and has opened for celebrities like Natalie Cole, Aretha Franklin and The Beach Boys. He has performed on some of the most renowned stages in show business, including Radio City Music Hall. Sarge got his first big break when he wrote, produced and performed for FOX network's Best Damn Sports Show Period. When NFL *Today* host Greg Gumbel encouraged him to "be a comedian, you're too funny, too creative and too bright not to go for a comedy career," Sarge took his advice. It's lucky for us that he did. Before Doc Grober even dreamed of becoming a surgeon, he was a pianist in a Pennsylvania band called Ron Grober's Quaker City Rhythm Kings, touring the northeast from Philadelphia to New York. The Doc eventually had to put his promising musical career to the side while he acquired a degree as an orthopedic surgeon. Doc Grober proved his talents in the medical field as well, receiving the honor of becoming the Florida team physician for the New York and St. Lucie Mets.

However, Doc Grober just couldn't give up his love of music. He rediscovered his love of the keyboard after the Pelican Yacht Club of Ft. Pierce asked the Doc to help them with an upcoming event that needed a jazz show. Doc Grober quickly stepped up to the plate, organizing a couple of talented local musicians to perform for the club. Despite not even having a name, the group achieved immediate recognition by the media and audience members. The Doc took the hint and christened the new musical collaboration Doc Grober & The Mudcats. The rest is history! Doc and his pals The Mudcats, along with legions of his loyal fans, will return for another toe-tapping, finger-snapping prescription for a fantastic night out!

Prepare to be astonished by classical music prodigy, Conrad Tao (Tuesday, March 25th at 7pm). Dubbed a musician of "probing intellect and open-

hearted vision" by the New York Times, Conrad Tao has, for nearly a decade, enjoyed a varied career as pianist, composer, violinist, and - most recently - presenter and curator. Born in Urbana, Illinois, to parents of Chinese descent, he was found playing children's songs on the piano at 18 months of age, gave his first piano recital at age 4, and four years later made his concerto debut performing Mozart's Piano Concerto in A Major, K. 414. In June of 2011, the White House Commission on Presidential Scholars and the Department of Education named Conrad a Presidential Scholar in the Arts, and the National Foundation for Advancement in the Arts awarded him a YoungArts gold medal in music. Later that year, Conrad was named a Gilmore Young Artist, an honor awarded every two years highlighting the most promising American pianists of the new generation. Conrad was also the only classical musician on Forbes' 2011 "30 Under 30" list of people changing the world. In May of 2012, he was awarded the prestigious Avery Fisher Career Grant. On his 19th birthday in June of 2013, Conrad

Whether he is singing selections from the Great American Songbook, standards by Sinatra with a full orchestra, contemporary classics, or stirring original pieces, every performance is a one-of-a-kind mesmerizing and unforgettable experience. A veteran of the Las Vegas music scene, Clint Holmes puts on unforgettable, energetic performances that are best seen live and up-close.
