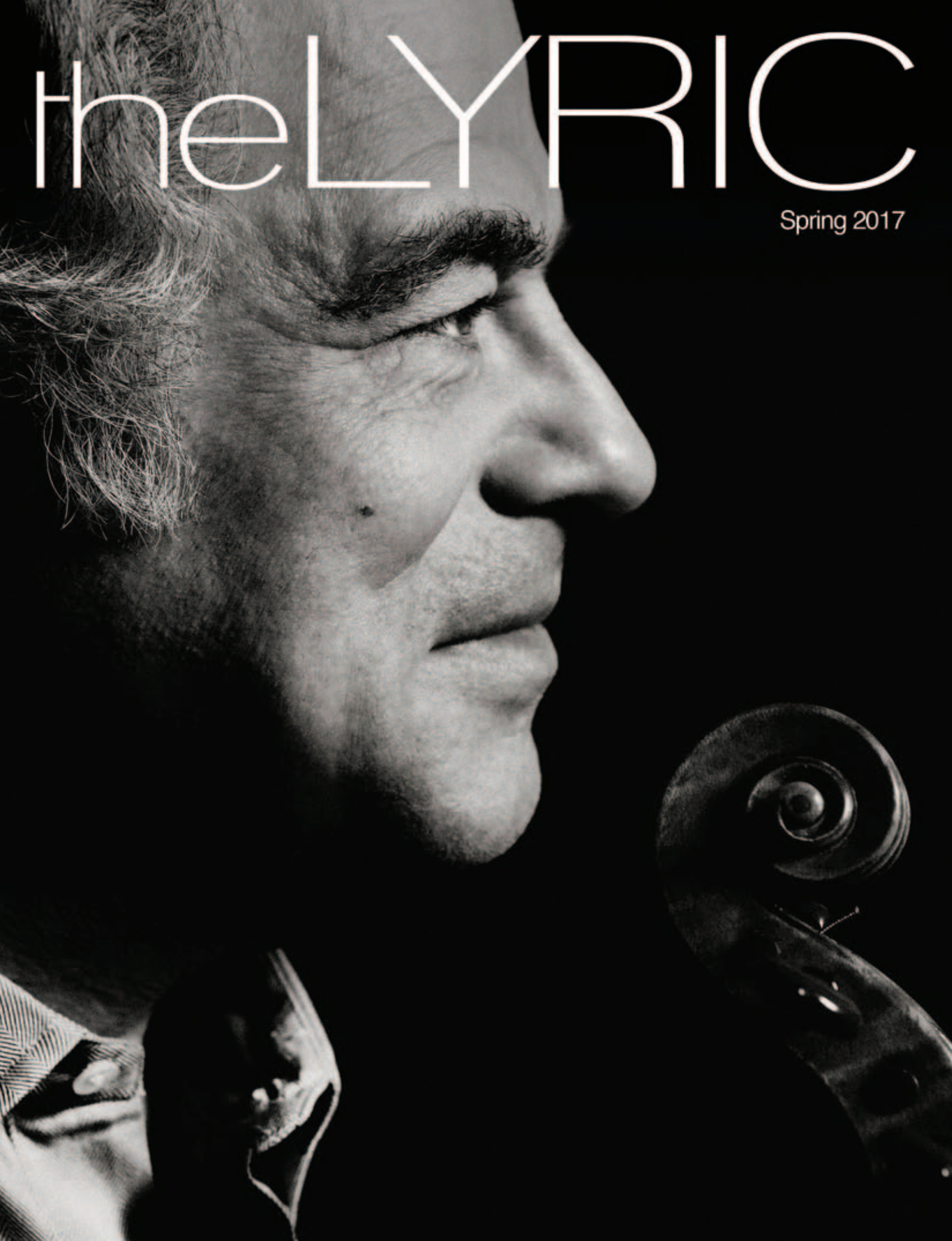

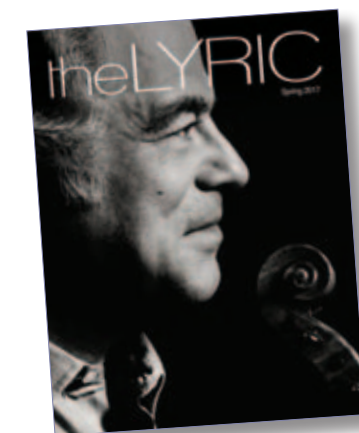

Each year, The Lyric Theatre prides itself on offering an impressive lineup of unique and exciting shows, and this spring season is no exception. Featuring artists from around the world, including internationally renowned violinists, home-grown Dixieland jazz bands, family-friendly acrobatic rock concerts and more, The Lyric has something for everybody.

Itzhak Perlman (March 7, 2017 7:00pm) The Lyric welcomes one of the most celebrated violinists in the world known for his exquisite renditions of classical, jazz, klezmer, and baroque pieces. With his incredibly rare and valuable 1714 Soil Stradivarius violin, Perlman has performed in venues across the world, including at a State Dinner at the White House honoring Queen Elizabeth II, as well as a Presidential Inauguration and was the recipient of the 2015 Presidential Medal of Freedom.

Born in Tel Aviv, Israel, in 1945, Itzhak Perlman began playing music at the age of 3, when he taught himself how to play the violin using a toy fiddle until he was old enough to study at the Shulamit Conservatory under Rikva Goldgart. Perlman contracted polio when he was four years old, limiting his mobility and forcing him to play the violin while seated. An incredible musician, Itzhak quickly gained international recognition, making his debut at Carnegie Hall in 1963 and winning the Leventritt Competition in 1964. Perlman has conducted the Detroit Symphony Orchestra as well as the Westchester Philharmonic, and teaches at the Juilliard School for their pre-college program. Spielberg's Oscar-winning film *Schindler's List* and the 2005 film *Memoirs of a Geisha*. In 2008, Perlman was awarded a Grammy Lifetime Achievement Award for his contribution to the recording arts.

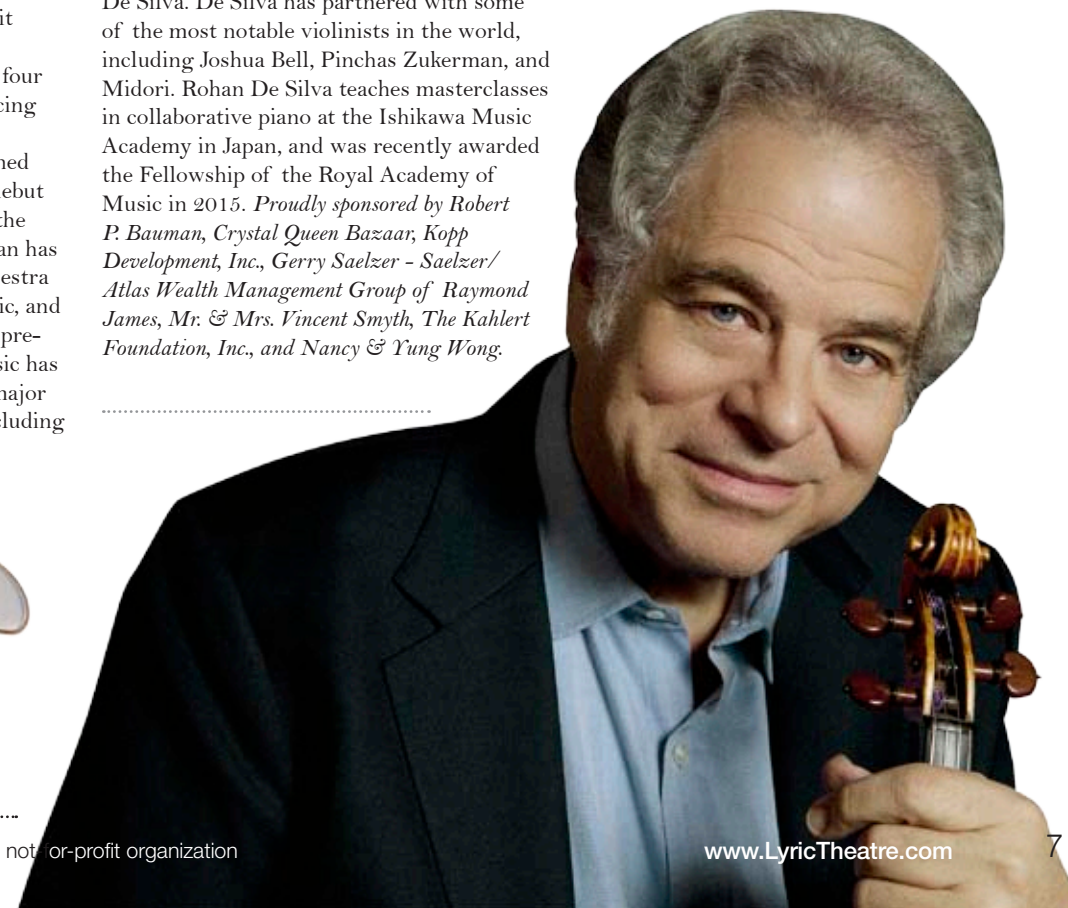
For his performance at The Lyric Theatre this season, Itzhak Perlman will perform a collection of classical pieces, from Strauss to Mozart. The legendary musician is known for both his technical ability and the joy he brings to every performance, making every one of his concerts a truly remarkable experience.

Joining Itzhak Perlman for his performance at The Lyric is collaborative pianist Rohan De Silva. De Silva has partnered with some of the most notable violinists in the world, including Joshua Bell, Pinchas Zukerman, and Midori. Rohan De Silva teaches masterclasses in collaborative piano at the Ishikawa Music Academy in Japan, and was recently awarded the Fellowship of the Royal Academy of Music in 2015. Clint Black (March 8 & 9, 2017 8:00pm) Returning again after a wildly successful performance at The Lyric Theatre, the singer-songwriter is one of the most successful musicians of all time with a staggering 20 million albums sold worldwide. Both a proud country musician and an artist unafraid to explore new genres, Clint Black amazes audiences across the country with his skills not only as a singer and guitarist, but as a drummer and harmonica player as well.

Clint Black began his career in the early 1980s, when he became inspired by major artists such as Reba McEntire and George Strait. After years of working part-time as a construction worker and bait cutter to support his burgeoning musical career, Black finally got his big break in 1989 with the release of his first album, *Killin' Time*, featuring some of his most celebrated hits including "Nobody's Home," "Walking Away," and the eponymous "Killin' Time." In June of 1989, the first single off of the album, *A Better Man*, reached the number one spot on the *Billboard* Hot Country Songs list. With that accomplishment, Clint Black became the first male solo artist in 14 years with a debut single at the top of the chart. *Killin' Time* quickly went triple-platinum and is now

known as one of the 100 greatest country music albums of all time. Since the release of *Killin' Time*, Black has continued to grow his career as an artist, earning over six awards, including CMA Male Vocalist of the Year, and a star on Hollywood's Walk of Fame.

After over a decade of success in the music industry, Clint Black left his record label to settle down and start a family. However, it was only a short while before Black returned to his love of music. In 2003, Black founded Equity Music Group, an artist-friendly recording company, and strove to help other aspiring young musicians follow in his footsteps. A wild success, Equity Music Group launched the careers of a number of musical groups, most notably the country vocal ensemble Little Big Town. In addition to his music career, Clint Black has appeared in films and on television. Black has appeared in a number of films, including *Maverick*, *Going Home*, and *Flicka 2*. Clint Black has also appeared on television in the animated series *King of the Hill* and the primetime reality TV show *Celebrity Apprentice*. In his spare time, Clint Black likes to give back to the community, serving as Honorary Chair for the International Rett Syndrome Foundation's "Research to Reality: Funding Progress" campaign, which aims to discover a cure for the developmental disorder.

Walter Parks "Swamp by Chandelier"

(March 11, 2017 7:00pm) Another beloved jazz and blues guitarist returns to The Lyric. The former lead guitarist for Richie Havens was born and raised in Jacksonville, Florida and he makes sure to incorporate a little Florida flair into every performance. With a unique, swamp-inspired style of finger picking and raspy vocals, Parks fuses traditional Southern rock riffs with the rhythm and blues, creating a unique sound of his own. In *Swamp by Chandelier*, Walter Parks will give you a taste of North Florida in his one-man guitar production inspired by the historic sounds of the Okefenokee Swamp.

Walter Parks first developed an interest in music after picking up the viola during music class. Parks soon learned that guitar was his instrument of choice, and the aspiring musician started his first group in 1973 called The Parental Tears Band. After momentarily enrolling in business school at the University of Georgia, Walter Parks realized that his true passion was music, and dropped out to return to Jacksonville in the 1980s to start a fusion jazz band called The Sneakers. Parks won a talent contest in 1989 and by 1991, the guitarist had formed The Nudes with cellist Stephanie Winters. The group produced three albums and toured successfully through the United States, performing at colleges and folk festivals. Parks shot to stardom in 2001, when legendary singer-songwriter Richie Havens invited him to join the band. Parks toured with Havens until 2011, when he decided to return to his roots and form Swamp Cabbage, a band that blends blues and jazz with North Florida southern rock. The group has recorded three albums, and their latest album *Jive* was released in April 2016. The name of the group comes from the delicacy made from the Sabal palm tree, which has been stewed by Creeks, Timuquans, Seminole and other native Floridians for centuries. Always inspired by the natural and cultural landscape of North Florida, Parks makes an effort to incorporate the sound of the swamp into every performance. For his performance at The Lyric Theatre, Parks is bringing back *Swamp by Chandelier*, a solo guitar performance that features an arrangement of Walter Parks' own compositions as well as some of the guitarist's favorite inspirations, including acoustic works by the legendary Richie Havens as well as some modernized interpretations of historic music from the Library of Congress archives.

Gary Arbuthnot "Celtic Connections."

(March 12, 2017 7:00pm) Next, check out world-class flautist in his latest show covering

genres ranging from classical to pop to jazz. Arbuthnot has traveled across the world, performing to sold-out audiences of all ages and backgrounds. For his performance at The Lyric Theatre, the Irish musician will perform some of the greatest Celtic classics, infusing his impressive musical performance with a dash of humor.

Gary Arbuthnot was born in Antrim, Northern Ireland in 1972. A highly talented flautist, Arbuthnot began his studies at the Royal Academy of Music in London, where he was awarded the Meaker Fellowship. Later, he studied at the prestigious McGill University in Montreal before breaking out on the classical music scene in 1998, earning prizes at the Markneukirchen and Carl Nielsen International Flute competitions. His talent and reputation only grew as the young musician earned awards from the Hattori Foundation, the Claudio Abbado European Young Musicians Trust, and the BBC Radio Three Young Artists Forum. Over his career, Arbuthnot has worked with a number of international symphonies, including the Royal Liverpool Philharmonic and the Opera de Lyon. Recently, Arbuthnot has begun performing on some of the top cruise lines in the world, including Celebrity Cruise Lines and Royal Caribbean. In his latest show *Celtic Connections*, the talented flautist will put a new spin on Celtic classics and beloved Irish melodies, bringing a taste of his homeland to The Lyric stage.

Yakov Smirnoff (March 16, 2017 7:00pm) A popular guest of *The Tonight Show* and an established figure in the entertainment industry since the 1970s, Yakov Smirnoff is a master of word play and social commentary. Known for his comedic persona of a Soviet immigrant discovering American culture for the first time, Smirnoff has continued to make audiences laugh over the past four decades. Yakov Smirnoff is a genius on the comedy stage, so influential in the international comedy scene that he was called "a national treasure" by Ronald Reagan himself.

Born in Odessa, Ukraine in 1951, Yakov Smirnoff immigrated to the United States in 1977, where he began performing stand-up comedy in Los Angeles. Smirnoff received his first big break when he landed a role in the 1984 film *Moscow on the Hudson* starring Robin Williams. Yakov then transitioned to television, where he was well known for his recurring role as Yakov Korolenko on the sitcom *Night Court*. From 1986 to 1987, Smirnoff starred in the TV sitcom *What a Country!* where he played a cab driver from the Soviet Union trying to study for the U.S. citizenship exam.

A BRIEF HISTORY OF THE LYRIC THEATRE



SPRING OF 1913

Construction for The "first" Lyric began on Osceola Avenue near Belle Flora and opened for its first performance a year later.

1917

The "first" Lyric was abandoned and moved to a little wooden structure on Osceola Avenue

MAY 27, 1925

Construction of The "new" Lyric Theatre commenced on Flagler Avenue

MARCH 15, 1926

The "new" Lyric Theatre opened to the public with the feature picture "Skinner's Dress Suit"



NOVEMBER 29, 1930

Newly equipped with RCA Photophone sound picture machines, The Lyric Theatre opened with railroad thriller "Danger Lights" (picture with sound)

1941

The Lyric Theatre fell on hard times after the depression and closed its doors. Over the following years, it was rented out to

community groups and was used to present traveling vaudeville shows, news weeklies and movies

1978

The Lyric was purchased by New Life in Christ Church and served as a venue for weekly services



(March 17, 2017 8:00pm) Unlike any jam band you’ve seen before, the DeadPhish Orchestra masterfully merge the music of the Grateful Dead and Phish into one unique concert experience. Through carefully crafted segues, DeadPhish Orchestra take on the folksy, bluesy sounds of the Grateful Dead and the aggressive funkiness of Phish and create a sound all their own. This season at The Lyric Theatre, the Colorado quartet will play some of your favorite songs from Bertha to Harry Hood and more.

What began as a group of friends playing some of their favorite Phish songs together in Colorado developed into one of the most unique tribute bands active today. DeadPhish Orchestra has toured across the country, from Redwood City, California to Boca Raton. The talented quartet has welcomed a number of guest musicians to perform with them, including members of the String Cheese Incident, Yonder Mountain String Band, and the Heavy Pets. Their cleverly designed performances and palpable passion for music allow audiences to experience all the best of jam music in one show.

Featuring Paul Murin on guitar, Ted Tilton on keyboards, Brian Adams on bass, and Chris Sheldon on drums, DeadPhish Orchestra will perform some of the greatest hits from the Grateful Dead and Phish on The Lyric stage this season. With set lists that transition seamlessly between artists, such as Divided Sky > Morning Dew > Divided Sky, DeadPhish Orchestra celebrate the spontaneity and improvisation that makes jam music so memorable.

“This Joint is Jumpin!” starring Ken Page

(March 18 & 19, 2017 7:00pm) Later in March, get ready for the legendary American cabaret singer and voice actor Ken Page as he celebrates the music of Fats Waller. Star of the original Broadway production of *Ain’t Misbehavin’*, Ken Page and a few special guests now take on the music of the celebrated jazz pianist and composer Fats Waller, in a tribute that features many of the pianist’s most beloved hits, including “Ain’t Misbehavin’” and “Honeysuckle Rose.”

Star of *This Joint is Jumpin!* Ken Page has enjoyed success on stage and beyond. In addition to creating the role of Ken in the original production of *Ain’t Misbehavin’*, Page played Old Deuteronomy in the original Broadway production and filmed stage production of *Cats, the Musical*. Beginning his Broadway debut as the Lion in *The Wiz*, Ken Page went on to star in *Dreamgirls* and in *Guys and Dolls*. *This Joint is Jumpin!* celebrates the music of the American jazz pianist, organist, composer, comedic entertainer, and singer Fats Waller. Waller is known for his innovations in the stride style made popular in Harlem in the 1920s and 30s. The virtuoso is recognized as laying the groundwork for the development of modern jazz piano. Two of the musician’s songs were inducted in the Grammy Hall of Fame in 1984 and 1999.

This Joint is Jumpin! starring Ken Page takes audiences on a journey through the music of the legendary pianist Fats Waller. Exploring the sounds of America in the 1920s and 30s, *This Joint is Jumpin!* features multi-talented vocalists and musicians celebrating the life and sounds of one of the greatest American musicians of all time.

MARCH 18, 1988

Friends of the Lyric entered into a contract with the New Life in Christ Church and purchased theater

1993-1995

With assistance from community grassroots efforts and grants, The Lyric Theatre underwent much needed repair from marquee improvements, exterior painting, new roofing and air-conditioning

systems, ADA compliance alterations, box office construction, and remodeling of the restrooms and dressing room

NOVEMBER 12, 1993

The Lyric Theatre was listed on the National Register of Historic Places

1996

New seating installed in the orchestra section and administrative offices constructed

2001

The Balcony of the theater was remodeled for the installation of new balcony seating, an elevator was installed and refurbishment of the lobby and restrooms



2004-2005

The expansion of The Lyric was commenced and completed, enlarging the stage by 14 feet, adding a backstage with flex-dressing area, a restroom, and office/storage areas. The “Star” dressing room also underwent renovation including shower and restroom.

SUMMER OF 2014

The Lyric was closed for substantial renovation as part of the Love The Lyric

Capital Campaign. Lobby and box office improvements, including new exterior and interior entrances, additional Box Office service windows, and bar. New orchestra seating and sound system were installed. The Lyric’s interior stucco walls were smoothed out and architectural elements added to the walls and columns.

Grand Reopening

SEPTEMBER 2015

Drawing inspiration from the organic and geometric forms of The Lyric’s exterior, The Lyric’s proscenium was ornamented in an Art Nouveau style. The elegant design contains artistry and craftsmanship of the trompe l’oeil art technique.

Decorative touches utilizing the trompe l’oeil art technique were added throughout The



Lyric including balcony parapet, doorway transoms, and interior theatre walls.

Low-income students experience theatre for the first time

The curtain opens, the lights come up, and the performers enter the stage. The sense of excitement and anticipation in that moment is electrifying for children coming to see live theatre here for the first time. For some of these children, the new, magical experience is something they never imagined they'd get to do because their families don't have the resources. The experience is made possible by a new partnership between The Lyric Theatre and U.S. Sugar to offer scholarships for Martin County Title 1 school students to attend the Discovery Series for Young Audiences.

The Lyric Theatre's Discovery Series for Young Audiences features dynamic live shows aimed at extending classroom lessons. In fact, all of the Discovery Series shows meet curriculum guidelines and enrich the students' learning experience. Through this series, children from nearby communities as young as 4 through middle school, attend who may not otherwise have the opportunity to see a live performance. Already, 385 children have been able to attend their first live theatre performance through the U.S. Sugar Scholarship Fund.

"I want to say thank you from the bottom of my heart for providing my students with the opportunity to attend the USA to Z show," said Caroline Guzman, a teacher at Indiantown Middle School. "We have a diverse student population, including many children who arrived in this country within the past few months and almost all of them receive free lunch and breakfast at school. Due to the socioeconomic background of our student population, many of them would not have the opportunity to leave Indiantown at all, let alone attend a musical at a beautiful historic theatre. Seeing live theatre opens their eyes to new possibilities in their own creative expressions."

This program has brought joy not only to the students and educators, but also to The Lyric. "It is amazing to witness children walk into the Theatre for their first time and simply light up," said Kia Fontaine, the Executive Director of The Lyric Theatre. "We are grateful to U.S. Sugar for recognizing a need in our community and helping underprivileged children get this magnificent opportunity to experience the arts."

The Discovery Series for Young Audiences will continue through the month of February before wrapping up for the year. There are scholarships still available based on a first-come, first-served basis available for students attending Title 1 schools.



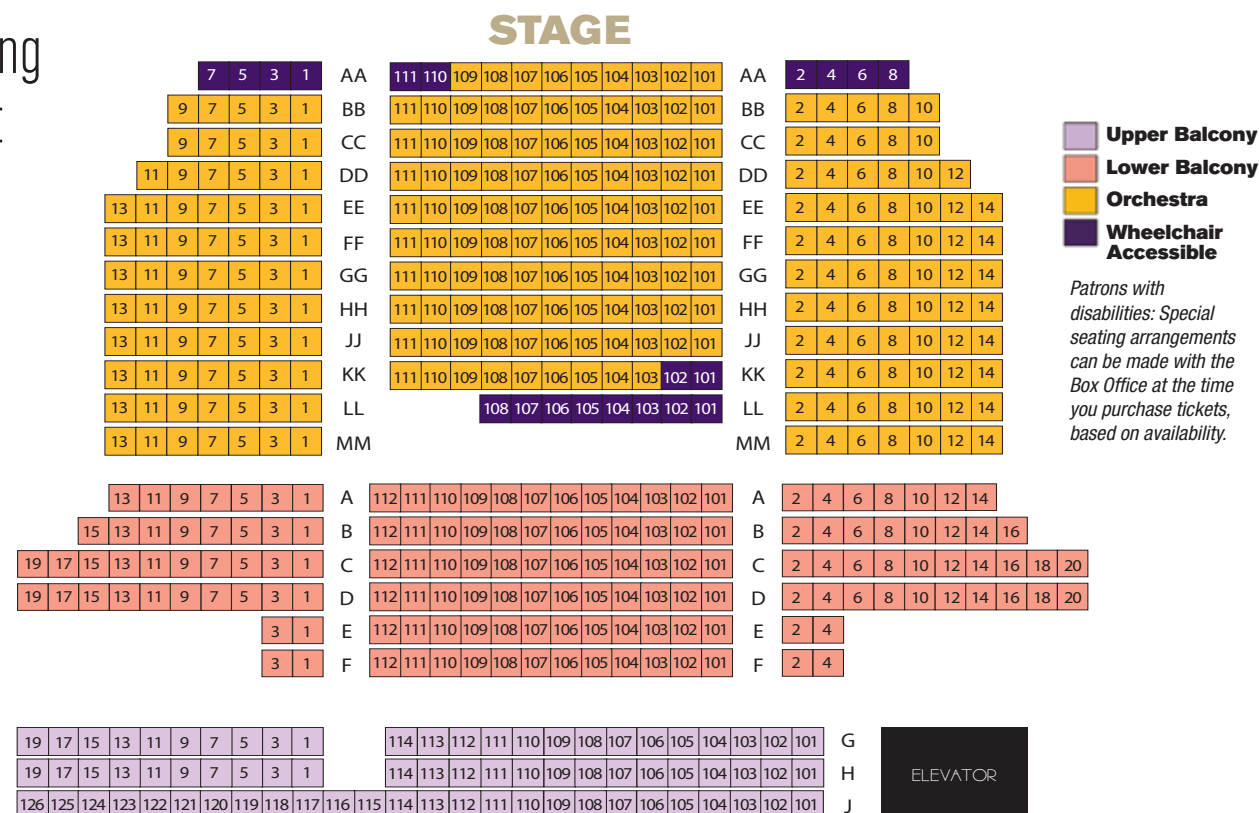

Nestor Torres "Havana & Buenos Aires"

(March 31, 2017 7:00pm) Returning to The Lyric Theatre is the contemporary master of the flute. A multi-talented musician whose influences range from jazz, to classical, to Latin genres, Torres has amazed audiences since the 1980s with his infectious melodies and powerful talent. In *Havana & Buenos Aires*, Nestor Torres will explore the music of Latin America, with a unique performance that brings the sounds of Havana and Buenos Aires to Martin County. The culmination of a brand-new joint venture in cultural enrichment between The Lyric Theatre and The Arts Council of Martin County, the performance will feature high school students from Martin County public schools who will work intensively with Nestor Torres in a series of master classes leading up to the performance on the 31st.

Nestor Torres was born in Mayaguez, Puerto Rico, where he developed a passion for the flute at the age of 12. After moving to New York City as a teenager, Torres quickly demonstrated his talents, attending the Mannes School of Music and, eventually, the New England Conservatory of Music in Boston. In 1981,

Nestor Torres moved to Miami where he began to incorporate his classical teaching with the passionate and rhythmic sounds of the South Florida music scene. Torres began to improvise using a Cuban dance style called "charanga" and soon the flautist began playing with some of the best local Cuban and Latin dance artists including Ray Barretto, Eddie Palmieri, and Celia Cruz.

Nestor Torres has continued making waves in the music industry, touring all around the world, performing with artists including Ricky Martin, Tito Puente, and Gloria Estefan. Over his career, Nestor has recorded a total of 14 solo recordings, including *Treasure of My Heart* and *My Latin Soul*, which were both nominated for a Latin Grammy. His album, *This Side of Paradise*, won the Latin Grammy for Best Pop Instrumental on September 11th, 2001. His latest album, *Nouveau Latino*, released in 2008, was hailed by critics as a refreshing return to the musician's roots, featuring lots of new improvisational approaches to Latin classics by artists such as Celia Cruz and Ruben Blades.

In addition to his dedication to music, Nestor Torres has also dedicated his life to promoting peace and education around the world. Nestor has received two honorary degrees from Barry University and Carlos Albizu University for his commitment to youth education and cultural exchanges in the Miami area and for his role as an Ambassador of Peace and Culture. Torres had the honor of representing the International Committee of Artists for Peace, performing at the opening ceremony of the International Campaign to Abolish Nuclear Weapons in Oslo, Norway, a summit attended by over 500 participants from more than 70 countries. Locally, Nestor developed the Nestor Torres Foundation, an organization designed to inspire social change through music, discussion, and education in the South Florida community.

In 2012, Nestor Torres worked with The Lyric Theatre in partnership with the Education Foundation of Martin County, conducting Master Classes for the most talented high school musicians in the area. These Master Classes culminated in a rousing Lyric Theater concert featuring Torres himself and his class pupils. This year, The Lyric Theatre and The Arts Council of Martin County have worked together to offer another series of Master Classes with the jazz flautist himself. A selection of some of the best high school musicians in

Martin County public schools will be invited to participate in intensive workshops with Torres, with a few lucky students invited to participate in the grand finale performance.

Ana Popovic

(April 6, 2017 7:00pm) Serbian blues guitarist Ana Popovic is back and better than ever. The award-winning, hard-touring, guitar slinger blends smoking electric funk and slide guitar, jazzy instrumentals and a tight blues groove with soulful, feminine vocals. Add to the mix her incredible stage presence, all of which makes her an irresistible force in the world of contemporary blues music. Nominated for five Blues Music Awards, Popovic is taking the American music scene by storm.

Born in Belgrade in 1976, Ana Popovic started playing the guitar at the age of 15. Actively encouraged by her father to embrace the blues genre, Popovic impressed local artists and music teachers with her innate abilities and creativity. In 1995, Ana formed the R&B group Hush, which marked the young guitarist's first experimentation with touring and performing. The group disbanded in 1998 when Ana went to the Netherlands to study jazz guitar. It was in 1999, after the formation of the Ana Popovic Band, that the blues musician really began to draw international attention. By 2009, Popovic had released the albums *Still Making History* and *Blind for Love*, which both reached #1 on the U.S. *Billboard* Blues chart.

Ana Popovic's *Blues Room* is an especially personal release for the guitarist. Recorded with her father Milton Popovic, the album is named after the room in which Ana's father first inspired her to pick up the guitar. After 10 years of attempting to convince her father to record an album with her, Popovic finally succeeded, creating a work that is both technically impressive and highly emotional.

In May 2016 Ana released *Trilogy*, her most ambitious project yet, twenty-three blues, jazz, and funk tunes on three CD's produced by Grammy-winning producer Warren Riker at the legendary Esplanade Studios. Guest appearances include Joe Bonamassa, Robert Randolph, Bernard Purdie (The Purdie Shuffle), Cody Dickinson (North Mississippi Allstars) and rapper Al Capone. *Trilogy* made it to the top 5 best selling blues albums on the *Billboard* chart.

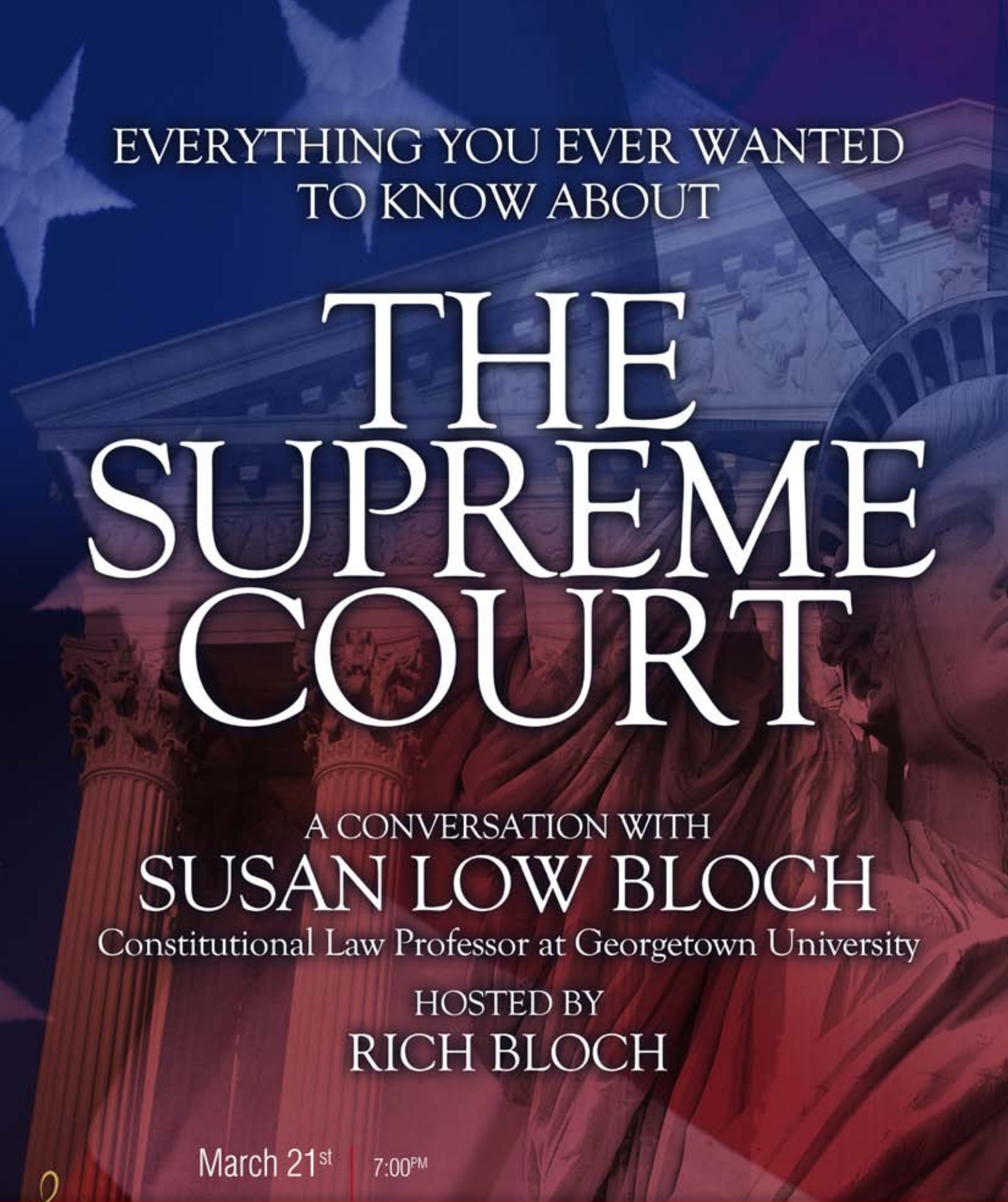
